Position Description: UTILITY WORKER 3 - CIVIL (G772)

April 2006

Purpose: To perform a wide variety of semi-skilled and unskilled labour related to Utility maintenance.

Duties: *(The duties described are representative of the position and are not all-inclusive.)*

Assists maintenance staff in performing tasks such as minor construction, building forms, mixing concrete, grounds maintenance, brush cutting, channel clearing, etc.

Performs a variety of construction duties such as raising and rebuilding manholes and chambers, sewer line connections, valve testing and road building, etc.

Assists with the training of junior staff on maintenance practices and procedures.

Operates ancillary equipment such as trucks, small tractors, lawnmowers, brush saws, weed eaters.

Operates compressors, pneumatic tools, electrical power tools, chain saws,

Performs site preparation and painting work.

Works in confined spaces and conducts safety monitor duties as required.

Assists in leak and/or other emergency repairs.

Obtains tools and parts from warehouses. Pickup and delivery from suppliers.

Works in compliance with all District safety policies, procedures and WCB regulations.

May act in the capacity of the Civil Maintenance Assistant Foreman as required.

Requirements:

Grade 12 or equivalent.

Mechanical ability and construction aptitude. Ability to operate power and pneumatic tools.

Ability to work in confined spaces and demonstrate safety awareness. Knowledge of the occupational hazards, WCB regulations, GVRD safety policies and procedures.

Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships in a team environment.

Ability to communicate effectively both verbally and in writing.

Physically capable of performing work duties and ability to perform shift work.

Valid B.C. driver's license.

Note: This position is a progression within the Civil Maintenance division from Utility Worker II (G602) upon completion of 5 years practical experience in the Utility Worker classifications AND successful completion of:

(a) 2 courses from Sacramento State Water Supply or Water Treatment or Wastewater Collection or Wastewater Treatment Level 1 and 2 courses; or

(b) an equivalent level of training plus the completion of Public Works PUBW 1001 – Municipal Plan Reading, PUBW 1141 at BCIT or an equivalent.
